

**Minutes**  
**San Anselmo Historical Commission Meeting**  
**November 21, 2018**

Judy Coy convened the meeting of the members of the San Anselmo Historical Commission at 7:30pm on November 21, 2018.

The minutes of the meeting of October 17, 2018 were approved. (Hendricks/Sousa)

Financial Report: Carol reported that the current balance is \$18,781.86 in the Society account. Judy reported a \$5.00 kickback from Amazon Smile program.

Discussion Items/Unfinished Business:

1. Oral History Project: Dick reported that he is scheduled to interview Malcolm McClorg this Friday. His sister is coming up from San Diego and will participate in the interview. Richard Torney suggested interviewing Warren Heiman whose father designed many buildings in town and served during WWI.
2. Collections/ Database/ Acquisitions/ Research Projects:
  - a. Acquisitions: Judy reported that Nick Roth brought in photos of a family picnic and the house at 51 Grove Lane in 1907. There was a split lot on Grove Lane at #45 and #51. Judy was able to figure out the names of the families at the picnic as Schulte, Smith and Todd.
  - b. Judy shared copies of the original hand drawn plans for 100 Alder that she obtained from Jeff Kroot.
  - c. Judy provided Brian Colbert with some history of Creek Park. Brian is working on a plan to reimagine Creek Park.
  - d. Rick created a nice article on the footbridge between Karl and Sais. Judy suggested approaching Public Works to have a sign/plaque made for the bridge with some of the information.
3. Publication of Historical Walk: No report.
4. Walking Tour Schedules and Participation: Dick reported that although he has not heard from St. Anselms yet, there is an upcoming tour with Hidden Valley in December.
5. Hallway Display for the Holidays: Judy is working with images that showcase snow in San Anselmo in 1913 and 1922. She plans to add a collection of snowmen.
6. Museum Docent Schedule: All shifts are covered.
7. New Business:
  - a. Update on San Anselmo Herald availability: Judy reported that the digitized San Anselmo Herald on Newspapers.com was supposed to be made available to the free California Digital Newspaper Collection (CDNC) this past July. However, CDNC is backlogged and the batch with the Herald from Newspapers.com is missing. Next April Judy will follow up. The museum still has the film and can send it back to be re-scanned if necessary.
