

March 23<sup>rd</sup> 1911

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo met this date in regular adjourned session at their meeting place designated by Ordinance.

Pres. W. E. Jones called the meeting to order at 8-30 P.M.

There were present Trustees Gagan, Schrader, Whitaker, Stratford and Jones.

The minutes of the meeting of March 9<sup>th</sup> 1911 were approved as read.

A communication dated March 10<sup>th</sup> 1911 from the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. requesting permission to set 4-25 foot poles on the South side of Sise Ave. West of the County Road was read whereupon Trustee Stratford moved that permission be granted. Seconded by Trustee Whitaker and duly carried.

A petition signed by a number of residents of Magnolia Ave. and Ross Valley Park Ave. protesting against the further confinement of two hounds in the rear of the premises on Ross Valley Park Ave. occupied by Mr. Hug. and the filthy condition of the enclosure was read and the Clerk was instructed to address a communication from the Board to be delivered by the Marshal demanding that same be remedied at once.

Two communications one from F. Grober dated March 22<sup>nd</sup> 1911 the other from Mary Mackenzie protesting against the unsanitary condition of the chicken yard maintained by Mrs. Martha Magee and her allowing the chickens to roam at large were read whereupon the Clerk was instructed to address a communication from the Board to be delivered by the Marshal demanding that same be remedied at once.

An Ordinance entitled "Providing

specifications for the installation and operation of moving picture machines" introduced and first read March 16<sup>th</sup> 1911 was again read and upon motion was approved and adopted as Ordinance No. 80 of the Town of San Anselmo by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Gagan, Schrader, Whitaker, Stratford and Jones.

Noes: None.

Absent: None.

An Ordinance entitled "To provide for the removal of debris and unburned portions of buildings resulting from the destruction or partial destruction by fire of buildings upon lots, sidewalks and streets within the Town of San Anselmo; defining a nuisance, and providing for its abatement, and fixing a penalty for the violation thereof." introduced and first read March 16<sup>th</sup> 1911 was on motion of Trustee Gagan, seconded by Trustee Schrader and duly carried withdrawn and an amended Ordinance of like title introduced and given its first reading.

An Ordinance entitled "Providing for license for moving picture shows" introduced and first read March 16<sup>th</sup> 1911 was again read and upon motion was approved and adopted as Ordinance No. 81 of the Town of San Anselmo by the following vote:

Ayes: Trustees Gagan, Schrader, Whitaker, Stratford and Jones.

Noes: None.

Absent: None.

Applications for permits for moving picture shows were considered whereupon Trustee Gagan moved to grant to S.A. Connor of San Francisco a permit to secure a license to operate a moving picture show. Seconded by Trustee Stratford and duly carried.

An Ordinance entitled "Regulating plumbing and sewer connections and the use of the same in the Town of San Anselmo:" was introduced and given its first reading.

Trustee Gagan moved to allow the following bills for payment by warrant on the Treasurer. Seconded by Trustee Stratford and duly carried.
