

Minutes of June 4th, 1917

The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, June 4th, 1917 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Perry, Latham, Redpath and Atthowe.
Absent, Trustee Kemp.

The minutes of the meetings of May 21st and May 23rd, 1917 were read and approved.

Petition for Water Mains

A petition for water mains on Foss And Melville Avenues from property owners in that vicinity was referred to Trustee Redpath.

Deeds for Road purposes

The Clerk presented a deed from Mr. R. A. Carey for the Roadways in Tamal Park as per unrecorded map thereof and stated that Mr. Carey had promised to bring in a certificate of title for same, but had failed as yet to present it. The deed was referred to the Town Attorney to take up the matter with Mr. Carey.

Another deed from Mrs. Mary Armer Pond for a portion of Lot 135 Ross Valley Park to round off the corner of San Anselmo Avenue at that point, was on motion of the Board duly accepted and the Clerk was directed to have same recorded. The Clerk was also directed to draw a warrant in favor of the Town Attorney for \$75.00 in payment of said deed as he had advanced the money to Mrs. Pond.

Bread Ordinance

Trustee Latham presented an ordinance regulating the size of loaves of Bread sold in the Town of San Anselmo, which ordinance was given a first reading.

Reports

Reports from the Marshal, Treasurer, Building Inspector and Electrical Inspector and Cashier of the Dance Platform were read by the Clerk and ordered filed.

Municipal Dance

Mr. Mitchel of the "Big Four" Club made a proposition to the Board to run the Municipal Dance Platform on a percentage basis with the Town. The matter was referred to Trustees Latham and Perry with power to act.

Sewer Complaint

A complaint from Mrs. Quinn residing in the Hillside Tract in reference to stoppage of her sewer was referred to Chief Cartwright to take up with the Sanitary Inspector.

Weed Nuisance

Trustee Perry introduced a Weed Resolution, being the first step in the proceedings for the removal of weeds on property with a view to charging the property therefor, and moved its adoption. The motion to adopt said Resolution was seconded by Trustee Latham and carried by the following vote:

Ayes, Trustees Perry, Latham, Redpath and Atthowe.
Noes, None. Absent, Trustee Kemp.

Crisp Lot

The Town Attorney reported that he had prepared all the papers necessary in the purchase of Lot 12 Block 1, Sunnyside Tract from Mrs. Crisp. He was directed to complete the negotiations as started by him.

Sale of Fire Wagon:

On motion of Trustee Perry, seconded by Trustee Redpath, the Finance Committee was directed to sell the old Fire Wagon now on storage at McLaren's Stables for the sum of \$75.00

Cancellation of Business Licenses:

On motion of Trustee Redpath, seconded by Trustee Perry, the following business licenses for 1916 were ordered cancelled and the Clerk directed to give the Marshal's account proper credit.
