

MINUTES OF JULY 7th, 1919

The Regular Monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on Monday evening, July 7th, 1919 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present, Trustees Perry, Michener, Stephenson, Kinberg and Taylor.-----Absent, None.

The minutes of the meeting of June 18th, 1919 were read and approved.

COMMUNICATIONS

A letter from Wm. M. Latham in reference to removal of grass and weeds from sidewalks and gutters was read and ordered filed.

A letter from James Byrne, Jr. in reference to removal of a tree from the sidewalk in front of his place was read and ordered filed.

A letter from Dr. E. D. Chipman requesting some repairs on Oak Avenue was upon motion of Trustee Perry, seconded by Trustee Michener referred to the Manager.

A letter from the Northwestern Pacific R. R. Co. in reference to the removal of grass on property adjoining the railroad was also referred to the Manager.

REPORTS

Re/ports were received and read from the Library Board, Fourth of July Committee, Marshall on Lights out, Fire Chief, Manager, Marshal, Superintendent of Streets and Building Inspector. All the reports were ordered filed.

Upon motion of Trustee Michener, seconded by Trustee ~~Kinberg~~, the report of the Library Board was laid over until the August meeting of the Board when the tax rate would be fixed.

Upon motion of Trustee Perry, seconded by Trustee Kinberg, the Manager was directed to pay to the Fourth of July Committee enough money from the receipts of the Dance Platform to make up the deficit as shown on their report.

DANCE PLATFORM

Trustee Perry moved that the Dance Platform be discontinued as it was obnoxious to his tenant. Said motion was seconded by Trustee Michener, but was lost by the following vote:

Noes " Stephenson, Kinberg and Taylor.

Trustee Perry thereupon withdrew from the meeting.

Trustee Stephenson moved that all of the interests of the Town in and to the Dance Platform be turned over to the San Anselmo Fire

Department, said Department to take full charge of said Dance Platform in future.

Upon motion of Trustee Michener, seconded by Trustee Kinberg and carried by the following vote:

the appointment of Mr. A. B. Schirmer as Deputy Marshall was approved. Mr. Schirmer was thereupon duly sworn in as Deputy Marshal by Trustee Taylor.
