MINUTES OF JULY 7, 1930.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Monday, July 7th, 1930, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen McKannay, Siemer, Jordan, Wright and Fusselman.  
Absent: None.  
Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

The several petitions signed by Sequoia Improvement Club for the removal of trees in Sequoia Park were read and referred to the Parks & Housing Committee.

Similar action was taken on the petition of H.A.Coleman, No.17 Tamal Ave. for the removal of certain trees in the sidewalk area fronting his property.

The petition of John H.B. Perlite and others for the installation of an additional light on Rosemond Ave. was read and referred to the Light Committee for consideration,

The recommendation of Mr. Rutherford concerning changes in the names of certain streets in the Hawthorn Hills Addition was referred to the Parks & Housing Committee.

Changes in locations and types of street signs as recommended and submitted in writing by the Chief of Police and the California State and Automobile Association were referred to the Street Committee.

The Report of the Chief of Police in connection with recent diagonal parking established in certain districts of the Town, was read and placed on file. Thereafter, a discussion on the subject was heard and it was agreed that the merchants objecting to parallel parking would meet with the Council at some early date and show cause why said parking should be abolished.

A communication signed A.H. Pape, Chairman of the Ross Valley Storm Drainage Committee, outlining tentative plans for the formation of a district from Whites Hill to Kentfield, for the purpose of clearing the Creek of all debris, etc. was read and placed on file.

The data, as furnished by the Pacific States Construction Company, concerning the building of Tennis Courts in the Town Park was read and the matter was referred to the Parks & Housing Committee, with instructions to come to the next meeting of the Council prepared to start proceedings in connection with the contemplated improvements.

GASOLINE BIDS:

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, July 22, 1930, at the hour of 8:30 P.M.
