Councilman Siemer also reported that the fire hazard on Elm Ave. adjoining the property of Mrs. Charick had been removed.

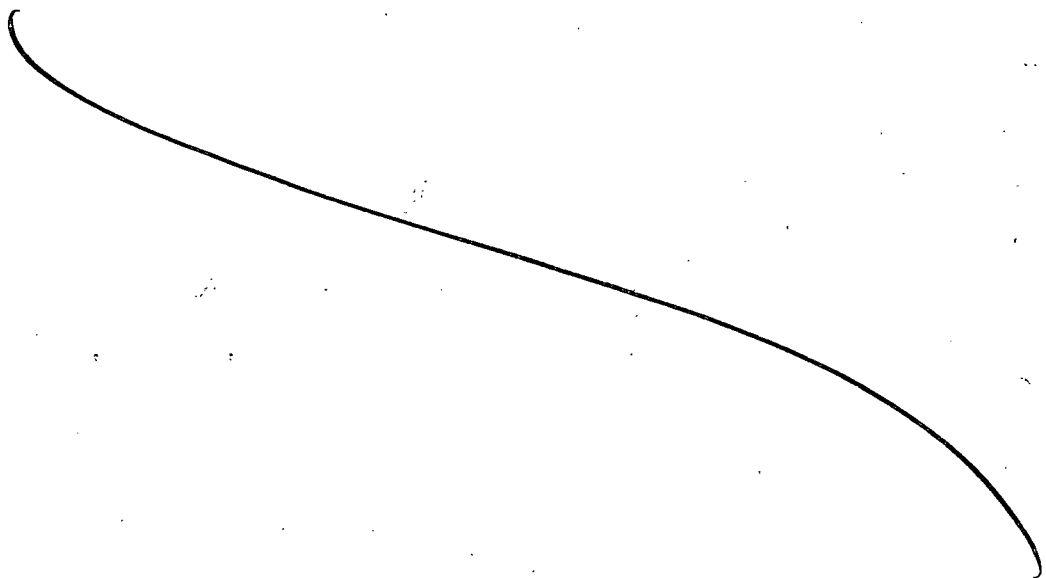
SEGREGATING AND APPORTIONING STREET ASSESSMENTS - OAK AVE.
