MINUTES OF MARCH 12, 1935.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, March 12th, 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, permission was granted Mrs. Beckley to remove several gum trees from a strip of land adjoining her home on Sunny Drive, Sequoia Park. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

A communication signed by officers of American Legion Post No. 179 of San Anselmo, requesting Council to appoint a committee to attend a meeting of the Boy Scouts Cabin and discuss with the Legionnaires a proposed drive to obtain funds with which to commence work on a recreation park and play grounds was read. ^{and filed.} The Chairman asked the Council as a whole to attend.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford a warrant was ordered drawn on the Treasury totaling \$6.00 in payment of annual dues of the local department to the Marin Co. Assn. of Fire Departments. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried unanimously.

A petition, bearing the signatures of Fred Carpenter and others protesting the granting of permission by the Town to the Schlosser Co. to erect oil storage tanks, was referred to the Parks and Housing Committee with instructions to confer with the Schlosser people as regards placement of tanks, etc. and to report back at the next meeting. Several of the protestants appeared before the Council who explained that Council was powerless in preventing the Company from erecting such oil tanks inasmuch as their holdings were zoned some years ago as industrial property.

Chairman Scotford reported on the recent installation of Stop signals by the Fire Department at a very minimum cost to the Town.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the Police Department was instructed to very rigidly enforce all traffic rules and regulations in the Town, in view of the numerous accidents during the past several months. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried unanimously.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the Police Committee was authorized to purchase and install a complete ultra high frequency police radio equipment consisting of 1 transmitter and receivers located in the tower of the Firehouse; 2 remote control stations, one located in office of Chief of Police and one in the office of the Fire Chief; and 2 transmitters and receivers located in police cars. Purchase to be made from R. Penlan and completely installed for approximately \$750.00

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, a transfer of \$280. from the "Morningside Court Gas Refund Trust Fund" to the General Fund was authorized. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the Street Committee was authorized to make the necessary repairs in the sidewalk area near ^{the bridge at} Lansdale Station. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried unanimously.

WARRANTS:

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, Warrants Nos. 1126 to 1178, incl., were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

Councilman Scotford was authorized to have several tracings of various subdivisions ^{in the Town} made.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the Street Committee was authorized to remove a tree from the street area on Upper Scenic Ave. near the Flood property. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, April 9th, 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.
