MINUTES OF APRIL 28th, 1936.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, April 28th, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dos Reis, Linch, Dempsey, White and Fusselman
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

Before reading and approving the minutes of the previous meeting, on motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the Clerk was instructed to omit the reading of the Resolution canvassing the election returns, the statement of the Clerk in connection with said canvass, as spread upon the Minute Book, and the Attorney was asked to check same and if found correct, to so advise the Council; this being done, the minutes of the meeting of April 20th were approved as read.

On motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman White, and

unanimously passing, the Council will disregard the petition filed with the Clerk and read at the last meeting and act upon its own initiative in the matter of rezoning a certain area north of Bridge Street, and fronting on the westerly side of Sir Francis Drake Blvd.

Thereafter, Ordinance No. 235, rezoning the above section of the Town was presented for first reading and was read.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, the Attorney was instructed to read Ordinance No. 237 (Regulation of business licenses, etc.) which was presented for first reading and so read.

A letter of thanks from the Directors of the Marvelous Marin Band for the donation recently received from the Town was read and placed on file.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of March, 1936 was received and placed on file.

ORDINANCE NO. 236 - (Municipal Investment Bonds)

An Ordinance providing for the issuance of Municipal Investment Bonds was presented for final reading and was passed and adopted by the following vote:

- Ayes: Councilmen Dos Reis, Linch, Dempsey, White and Fusselman.
- Noes: None.

The Ordinance was then signed by the Mayor and numbered 236. ✓

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Dos Reis, The Fire and Police chiefs were authorized to have notices printed and mailed to property owners in the Town to remove all grass and weeds constituting a fire menace, not later than June 15th.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Dos Reis, and unanimously passing, permission was granted for the removal of a tree on the south side of Tamalpais Ave. permitting free access to the new store adjoining the Piggly Wiggly structure, with the proviso that a tree be replanted.

The Police Chief reported satisfactorily to the Council on the nuisance complained of several weeks ago by Mr. Shearer, and referred to him for investigation.

Councilman White recommended that a street light be placed at the corner of Sunny and Sequoia Drive and the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to so advise the Pacific Gas & Electric Co.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, May 12, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.
