MINUTES OF APRIL 13TH, 1937.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, April 13th, 1937, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.

Absent: None.

The minutes of the meetings of March 9th and 18th were approved as read.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, permission was granted Don Perry to remove certain trees fronting his property along Sir Francis Drake Blvd. north of Barber Avenue.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, permission was granted Mr. Ferrero for the removal of a tree fronting his property on Belle Ave.

The following communications were received and placed on file:

- Geo. U. Hind, concerning additional contribution to the Humane Society;
- F. H. Allen, in reference to changing the name of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and from the Chamber of Commerce, Santa Rosa, proposing holiday for the Golden Gate Bridge Fiesta.

The petition of A. U. Welch, 118 Laurel Ave., for the removal of an abandoned building on the land adjoining his ^{Property} Avenue was read and the Clerk was asked to notify the writer that the Council has no objection, providing petitioner will assume all responsibility in connection with such removal.

The petition of the Morningside Court Improvement Club for the lowering of a rock ledge in the Creek, running through the Cordone Tract, was referred to the Street Committee for recommendation.

A communication from J. D. Holbrook, Chairman of the San Anselmo Recreation Park and Playground Committee, offering to turn over to the City Council all moneys remaining on hand, totaling \$220.25, and urging Council to begin installation of recreational equipment, was received and placed on file and the Clerk was instructed to acknowledge with thanks such offer.

The petition of the Telephone Company to install additional conduit, cable and one manhole about September 1st, 1937, was received and the matter was referred to the Street Committee for consideration.

A certified copy of a Resolution passed and adopted by the Marin Municipal Water District, at the meeting of March 27th, 1937, concerning installation of larger mains and hydrants was received and referred to the Fire Chief for consideration.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to make such expenditures for the Fire, Street, Parks and Housing Departments, also for the Tax Office supplies, as set forth in his written request of even date.

RESOLUTION NO. 124 (REJECTION OF BIDS FOR TENNIS COURTS)

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, Resolution No. 124, rejecting bids and providing for the return of all bids (unopened) was unanimously passed and adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 125 (CALLING FOR BIDS OF TENNIS COURTS):

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Franchini, Resolution No. 125, calling for bids on the Tennis Court, May 11th, 1937, was unanimously passed and adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 243 (PLUMBING):

An Ordinance adopting the "Standard Plumbing Code" was presented for final reading and was passed and adopted by an unanimous vote of the Council. Thereafter, it was signed by the Mayor and numbered 243.

An Ordinance creating and establishing a Civil Service System for certain Town employees was presented for first reading. On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, such first reading was by title only.

WARRANTS: On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Warrants Nos. 2679 to 2752, inclusive, were ordered paid.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of March, 1937 was received and placed on file.

The Clerk was instructed to advise the City Councils of the Towns of Ross and Fairfax that the San Anselmo Council will place a Proposition on the ballot at the next General Election, whereby it will abandon certain portions of Sir Francis Drake Blvd.

The Clerk was instructed to notify S. A. Post No. 179, American Legion, that the City Council will set May 11th, 1937 at 8 o'clock P.M. for a public hearing of all persons objecting to the closing and abandoning of portions of San Diego Ave. and Los Angeles Blvd.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, April 20th, 1937, at 8 o'clock P.M.
