PARKING PROBLEM AT DRAKE HIGH SCHOOL

Mayor Booth stated that numerous complaints had been registered with council members, police, and city offices relative to the destruction of no parking signs which had been posted by the Police Dept., and scattering of refuse left over from lunches in the creek area and on the streets and lawns in the neighborhood of the school. Mr. Edmund Thomas representing the school said that no such complaints had been received by the board or high school, and had they been, the board would have taken immediate steps to correct the situation, and that they would do everything they could immediately to correct the situation complained of. Mr. Davids said that he felt the restriction of use of automobiles by the students was too drastic a measure, and felt the students should be allowed the use of their cars and that the parking area would be completed for the off the street parking of these cars as soon as possible. Mr. Knoles requested that permission to cut back the curbs at the bus driveways at Saunders Ave. and Taylor Ave. be granted. Permission granted on the motion of Councilman Knoles and seconded by Councilman O'Mara on the following vote:

STREETS- MORNINGSIDE COURT NO. 4

City Attorney Buresh reported that he had contacted Carey Bros. relative to proceeding with the street work and had been informed that Mr. Brandt, the sewer contractor, had been unable to get on the job. Mr. Buresh said that on investigation, he had been informed that Mr. Brandt was not doing this work. Mr. Dave Carey said that he had been assured that Brandt would do the sewer work and that ~~Brown~~^{IKE}-Ely Co. would do the roadwork. Resolution relative to failure of Carey Bros. to complete work and the city assuming the responsibility for completion of the roadwork read by the City Attorney. City Engineer Siemer asked that if the City does intend to proceed and take over the roadwork, that they hire another engineer for supervision of this job. Mr. Carey said he would be agreeable to placing \$1500. in escrow with the City Clerk to be released on the signatures of the City Engineer and Councilman Knoles on the completion of the sewer work, and that he would authorize Mr. Carcano to be in

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD OCTOBER 9, 1951

A regular meeting of the San Anselmo City Council was held at the City Hall, San Anselmo, Tuesday, October 9, 1951 at 8:00 P.M.

PROPOSED SITE FOR FUTURE MOVING OF FIRE DEPARTMENT.

Mayor Booth stated that the City had been exploring for many years the possibility of relocating the fire house and that several sites have been considered over the years. Councilman Knoles had presented the proposal to the council some time ago that the O.W. Jones site off the N.W. P. Right of Way be considered, and selected a man to make this investigation for the City Council. Mayor Booth further stated that no negotiations have taken place to date, no money exchanged or further action taken by the council in the matter. Mayor Booth said that Mr. Knoles had done a fine job as a city councilman and that she regretted his resignation.

RESIGNATION OF COUNCILMAN SAMUEL S. KNOLES READ AND ORDERED FILED.

PROPOSED BEAUTIFICATION AND ESTABLISHMENT OF PARK AREA AT THE CORNER OF S.F. DRAKE BLVD. AND TUNSTEAD AVENUE. Mr. Lund representing the V.F.W., Lion's Club, Chamber of Commerce, Rotary Club and American Legion requested permission of the City Council on behalf of the various service clubs of the city to beautify the area at the corner of S.F. Drake Blvd. & Tunstead Ave. and create a rustic setting with benches and lawns where people might rest while waiting for bus transportation. Moved by Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Skinner that permission be granted and that the clerk write the clubs and thank them for their proposal.

STREET LIGHTING-- YOLANDA COURT.

Lyle Smith and Mr. Wolbert representing the P.G. & E. discussed the lighting service of Yolanda Park and stated that several violations of the state regulations are in existence and that several hazards exist. Suggested that a member of the council meet with them and work out a more suitable plan for lighting this area. Councilman Smith to work with Mr. Smith and Wolbert and report to the council Mayor Booth expressed a wish that something be done immediately to give residents some temporary relief, as this area is very dark and dangerous and will be moreso during the winter months.
