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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include input from Red Hill merchants, Parkside Apts., Drake governance classes and ICC Homes residents. • Include permaculture garden, outdoor meeting space, teen area, solar. • Keep art and mosaics in the park. • Playing field should have a snack bar with a second story for announcers. • If possible, assure people that healthy, existing trees will remain if possible. • Current uses should include dogs. • Identify more clearly what ICC is and where the meeting rooms are; include better signage. • Maybe all the current playing fields aren't needed. 	<p>Q. What about a community center? A. A Facilities Master Plan was approved last year for a community center, and the park project will transition into it.</p> <p>Q. What about the Log Cabin? A. It is completely separate from the park.</p> <p>Q. How can more input into the playground be incorporated, such as play areas with more risk? A. There are special program area meetings that will be specifically for features of the park, like playground.</p> <p>Q. Can loved features of playground be retained? A. Yes.</p> <p>Q. Is an all-season field artificial turf? A. Yes.</p> <p>Q. What is the goal for completion? A. This is an opportunity to plan so that when funds are available we are ready to go.</p> <p>Q. How are costs estimated? A. The Architect uses industry standards. Costs will change based on elements chosen and decisions made by the community.</p> <p>Q. What about funding from the County Parks tax? A. The Town gets about \$70K/year for Memorial Park from the Parks tax.</p> <p>Q. Why put together all this when we don't know if we can afford it? A. The process includes visioning to put together a plan, which is needed for grant applications.</p>
