Ordinance # 34

Establishing Water Rates for the Marin County Water Company.

The Board of Trustees of the
Town of San Anselmo do ordain as
follows.

Section 1

The monthly water rates to be
charged by the Marin County Water
Company are hereby fixed and established
as follows:

First. For tenements covering ground
surface under 600 ft, occupied by no
more than 5 persons, who shall use
water for domestic purposes exclusively,
\$1.00

For a ground surface covered by
tenements so used:

Provided, however, that no extra charge
be made for second and third stories
when not occupied.

Second. For families of more than 5 persons,
for each adult above that number, fifteen
cents (15¢)

Third. Bath tubs in private houses,
for each tub, 50 cents; in public houses,
boarding houses, bathing establishments
and barber shops, each \$2.00

Fourth. Hoses, kept for private use, each 25 cents; washing vehicles, each 25 cents; caws, each 25 cents.

Fifth. Sivery stable, including water for washing vehicles, for each horse and vehicle 50 cents.

Sixth. For each horse trough on sidewalk \$2.00

Seventh. For water used for washing windows and sidewalks charge may be made in addition to that for other uses of one cent per linear front foot of the premises to be washed, if done with a hose.

Eighth. For each water closet in public buildings \$2.⁰⁰; for lodging houses, board houses, \$1.⁰⁰; for water closets for use in one private dwelling 50 cents; for each additional water closet for use in each private dwelling, 25 cents.

Ninth. For each barrel of lime or cement used, 25 cents; wetting bricks for building per thousand 25 cents.

Tenth. Irrigation of lawns, gardens or grounds, one half of one cent per square yard per month, payable every month of the year, provided there shall be no charge for irrigation less than 25 cents per month.

Eleventh. Hotels, taverns, lodging houses and boarding houses shall be charged for board and lodgers within the San \$5 cents, but this shall not include bath tub or water closet, which shall be separately charged as above.

Twelfth. Restaurants, \$3.⁰⁰; saloons, \$2.⁰⁰; laundries, \$10.⁰⁰; carriage manufacture \$1.⁵⁰; stockyards and pasture grounds, for each of head of stock, 25 cents.

Thirteenth. Babines, \$1.00

Fourteenth. Fountains to be supplied at meter rates.

Fifteenth. Meter rates charged per

each one thousand gallons as follows:

sixteenth. Stores, offices, warehouses, and tenements not mentioned in any other classification and requiring only an ordinary amount of water at rates provided for in the first item of this section.

Section 2 The said company shall in all cases have the right to attach meters for the purpose of measuring the quantity of water used, and may charge meter rates as provided for in the fifteenth item of Section 1 of this Ordinance. Upon demand of any consumer within thirty days notice thereof, the said company shall attach a meter. No rental shall be charged for meters. The meter rates as provided for in Section 1, item 15 of this Ordinance, shall continue for the residue of the year ending the succeeding first of July. Provided that no monthly meter bill shall be less than \$2.00 per month.

Section 3

The company by its authorized agent, shall have the power at all times during reasonable hours, to enter any premises to which water may be supplied for the purpose of examining the condition of all water pipes, water closets, and, in case a leak be found, to shut off the water until the leak be stopped by the consumer; the actual cost of labor, and no more, to be charged in such case for turning off and on the water and the company shall be authorized to collect the sum of four dollars \$4 per meter for cost of attaching the same, from the consumer for whose benefit said meter is attached.

Section 4

Meter and city rates are due and payable at the end of each month, and upon meter rates a deposit not exceeding three fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the value of the estimated quantity of water to be consumed may be required. All rates except meter and city rates are due and payable in advance.

Section 5

Water for sprinkling the streets, 20 cents per thousand gallons.

Section 6

This Ordinance shall take effect on the first day of July, 1905 and remain in force one year and no longer.

Section 7

All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
