

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OR DISPENSATION OF INTOXICATING LIQUORS IN THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO BY IMPOSING A FINE, PENALTY OR FORFEITURE OF FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00) FOR A BREACH OF SAID ORDINANCE.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1.- Every person, firm, company or corporation, selling, giving away, or otherwise dispensing any spirituous, malt, vinous or other intoxicating liquors or wines in the Town of San Anselmo without first obtaining a license so to do from the Board of Trustees of said Town, shall be punishable by a fine, penalty or forfeiture in the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, recoverable by civil action.

Section 2.- This ordinance shall not repeal or otherwise affect any other existing ordinance on this subject, but shall provide an alternative measure by which the sale or dispensation of intoxicating liquors may be lawfully regulated.

Section 3.- This ordinance is for the immediate preservation of the public peace, the facts constituting its urgency being as follows: Certain persons purport to have organized clubs, so-called, for the purpose of defying the lawful ordinances of the Town and selling or dispensing intoxicating liquors without a license.

Section 4.- This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
