

ORDINANCE NO. 148

REGULATING THE SALE OF BREAD AND ESTABLISHING THE STANDARD WEIGHT THEREOF AND, REQUIRING APPARATUS USED BY PEDDLERS AND HAWKERS TO BE TESTED AND SEALED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF WEIGHTS AND MEASURES AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1.- All loaves of bread made or procured for the purpose of sale, sold, offered, or exposed for sale in the Town of San Anselmo shall weigh, when baked, not less than twelve ounces avoirdupois, except as hereinafter provided, and such weight shall be the standard weight of a small loaf in the Town of San Anselmo.

Section 2.- Bread may also be made or procured for sale, sold or offered or exposed for sale in twenty-four ounce loaves, which shall be known as a standard large loaf; also in double, triple, quadruple, quintuple or sextuple loaves and in no other way.

Section 3.- A commercial tolerance is hereby fixed for small loaves of two ounces and for large loaves of four ounces, and there shall be no tolerance below the fixed standard weight.

Section 4.- Bread commonly known as large loaves, when made or procured for the purpose of sale, sold or offered or exposed for sale, shall be considered a large loaf within the meaning of this ordinance and shall not be sold, exposed or offered for sale at a less weight than herein fixed for a large loaf. The commercial tolerance fixed for a large loaf shall apply to the large loaf.

Section 5.- All inspections of the weight of bread shall be made on the premises of the maker or manufacturer, and all weight of bread shall be determined by taking an average weight of not less than twenty loaves.

Section 6.- The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to crackers, pretzels, buns, rolls, scones or leaves of fancy bread weighing less than one-fourth of a pound avoirdupois, or to what is commonly known as "Stale Bread" sold as such, provided the seller shall, at the time of sale, expressly state to the buyer that the bread so sold is stale bread.

Section 7.- PEDDLERS AND HAWKERS All itinerant peddlers and hawkers using weights or measures, weighing or measuring devices, before obtaining a license from the Tax Collector shall bring any or all such devices in their possession to the office of the County Sealer of Weights and Measures, once annually to have the same inspected, tested and sealed and obtain therefrom a certificate to present to the Tax Collector that the provisions of the above ordinance have been complied with.

Section 8.- Whenever in this ordinance the terms "Sealer of Weights and Measures" is used, such terms shall include all Deputy Sealers of Weights and Measures.

Section 9.- Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars or by imprisonment in the County Jail for not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 10.- This ordinance shall be enforced by the County Sealer of Weights and Measures.

Section 11.- This ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately.
