

ORDINANCE NO. 210

AMENDING SECTIONS 3 AND 4 OF ORDINANCE 89, ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 13th, 1911, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF RUBBISH AND OTHER INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS AND ASHES, PROHIBITING THE LIGHTING OF FIRES UPON THE PUBLIC HIGHWAYS AND STREETS AND VACANT LOTS, PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF RUBBISH AND OTHER USELESS MATERIAL AFTER FIRE, PROHIBITING THE INTERFERENCE OF THE FIRE ALARM SYSTEM, AND THE MAKING OR GIVING OF FALSE ALARMS OF FIRE IN THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO", AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 157 ADOPTED AUGUST 4th, 1919.

The City Council of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of Ordinance 89, adopted September 13th, 1911, as amended by Ordinance No. 157, adopted August 4th, 1919, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to lay or light, or cause to be laid or lighted, any bonfire upon any public street or highway within the corporate limits of the Town of San Anselmo."

Section 2. Section 4 of said Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to lay or light, or cause to be laid or lighted, within the corporate limits of the Town of San Anselmo, any bonfire, or any fire for the disposal of any trash, papers, garbage, grass, straw, brush, leaves, or other inflammable substance, when such fire is laid, lighted or maintained outside of any house or other building, or within any other open space in said Town, without first having obtained a written permit so to do from the Fire Chief, or Fire Marshall, or their authorized deputies or unless such fire is confined in a stove or container approved by said Fire Chief or Fire Marshall, or their authorized deputies.

It shall be unlawful to have any such fire or fires

burning after the hour of 11 A. M. whether attended or un-
attended, and all such fires shall be thoroughly wet down
or covered with earth, or otherwise extinguished, by the
hour of 11 A. M."

Section 3. All ~~Ordinances or~~ parts of Ordinances
in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4. The Clerk is hereby directed to cause
this Ordinance to be published once in the Marin Herald, a
weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and cir-
culated in said Town of San Anselmo, and hereby designated
for that purpose.

Section 5. This Ordinance is declared to be for
the immediate preservation and protection of the public peace,
health and safety and one of urgency and shall take effect
immediately upon its passage and approval. The facts con-
stituting such urgency are the approaching dry season of the
year and the presence in and around said Town of large quanti-
ties of dry grass, brush and leaves, and the necessity for the
immediate protection of persons and property in said Town from
fire caused by the careless and unsupervised burning thereof.
