

ORDINANCE NO. 222

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 20 OF ORDINANCE NO. 155 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT, LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES" ADOPTED NOVEMBER 4, 1918, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 214 ADOPTED JUNE 9, 1931, AND AS FURTHER AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 218 ADOPTED MAY 2, 1933.

The City Council of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 20 of Ordinance no. 155 entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment, Levy and Collection of Taxes" adopted November 4, 1918, as amended by Ordinance No. 214 adopted June 9, 1931, and as further amended by Ordinance No. 218 adopted May 2, 1933, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 20. On or before the second Monday in August of each year the Tax Collector shall publish the delinquent list for two successive weeks in a newspaper published and circulated in said Town, which list shall be substantially in the following form:

Delinquent Tax List

The following is the delinquent tax list for the fiscal year ending _____, the names of the persons and a description of the property delinquent, and the amount of the taxes, penalties and costs due, opposite each name and description, with the taxes due on personal property added to the taxes on real estate where the real estate is liable therefor:

(Here follow list)

Notice is hereby given that unless the taxes delinquent, together with the costs and penalties, are paid, the real property upon which such taxes are a lien will be sold on _____ 19____ to the Town of San Anselmo.

Tax Collector.

The time of sale shall not be less than fifteen nor more than thirty days from the first publication of said notice."

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this ordinance to be published once in the "Marin Herald", a weekly newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in said Town of San Anselmo, and hereby designated for that purpose.

1st Reading

Section 3. This ordinance is an emergency measure required for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety. The facts constituting such emergency are the passage by the State Legislature of an Act extending for sixty days from April 20, 1933, the time for payment of taxes on real property, for imposing penalties and for publication of the delinquent list, and the immediate necessity that the ordinance of said Town providing for the collection of taxes be made to conform with said Act of the Legislature; and to that end this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
