ORDINANCE NO. 230

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 155 ENTITLED
" AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT, LEVY
AND COLLECTION OF TAXES ", APPROVED NOVEMBER 4,
1918, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 14 and 17
OF SAID ORDINANCE.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 14 of Ordinance No. 155 of the Town of San Anselmo, entitled, " An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment, Levy and Collection of Taxes " approved November 4, 1918, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 14. On or before the first Monday of October of each year, the Assessment Roll shall be delivered to the Tax Collector of the Town, who shall within ten days after such delivery forthwith publish in a newspaper published and circulated in said Town, a notice specifying:

That the taxes on all personal property secured by real property and one-half of the taxes on all real property will be due and payable on the 1st day of November of each year, and will be delinquent on the 5th day of December next thereafter, at five o'clock P. M., and that unless paid prior thereto, eight per cent (8%) will be added to the amount thereof, and that if said one-half be not paid before the 20th day of April next thereafter, before five o'clock P. M. of said day, an additional three per cent will be added thereto; that the remaining one-half of the taxes on all real property will be payable on and after the 20th day of January next after said November above mentioned, and will be delinquent on the 20th day of April next thereafter, at five o'clock P. M., and that unless paid prior thereto, three per cent will be added to the amount thereof; provided, however, that whenever

1 either December 5th or April 20th, shall fall on Saturday
2 taxes shall become delinquent at twelve o'clock noon on
3 said date; provided further, that whenever either December
4 5th, or April 20th shall fall on Sunday or any other legal
5 holiday, taxes shall become delinquent at five o'clock P.M.
6 on the next succeeding business day.

7 That all taxes may be paid at the time the first in-
8 stallment, as herein provided, is due and payable.

9 The times and places at which payment of taxes may be
10 made. The Tax Collector may fix a date in advance of the
11 due date when payments may be made.


12 Section 2. Section 17 of Ordinance No. 155 of the
13 Town of San Anselmo, entitled " An Ordinance Providing
14 for the Assessment, Levy and Collection of Taxes ",
15 approved November 4, 1918, as amended, is hereby amended
16 to read as follows:

17 Section 17. On the fifth day of December of each
18 year, at five o'clock P. M., all taxes then unpaid, ex-
19 cept the last installment of real property taxes, are de-
20 linquent, and thereafter the Tax Collector must collect,
21 for the use of the Town, an additional eight per cent
22 thereon; provided, that if said taxes be not paid before
23 the twentieth day of April next succeeding, at five o'clock
24 P. M., he shall collect an additional three per cent there-
25 on. On the twentieth day of April of each year, at five
26 o'clock P. M. all the unpaid portion of the remaining one-
27 half of the taxes on all real property is delinquent, and
28 thereafter the Tax Collector must collect, for the use of
29 the Town, an additional three per cent thereon; provided,
30 that the entire tax on any real property may be paid at
31 the time the first installment, as above provided, is due


1 and payable ; and provided further, that the taxes on all
2 personal property, unsecured by real property shall be due
3 and payable immediately after the assessment of said per-
4 sonal property is made, provided, however, that when the
5 fifth day of December or the twentieth day of April, shall
6 fall on Saturday, all taxes then unpaid shall become de-
7 linquent at twelve o'clock noon, on said date; provided
8 further that whenever either the fifth day of December or
9 the twentieth day of April shall fall on Sunday or any
10 other Legal Holiday, all taxes then unpaid shall become
11 delinquent at five o'clock P. M. on the next succeeding
12 business day.

13 Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to
14 cause this Ordinance to be published once in the Marin Herald,
15 a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and cir-
16 culated in said Town of San Anselmo, and hereby designated for
17 that purpose, and said ordinance shall be in force and effect
18 thirty (30) days after its final passage.
