AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 207 ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HERewith" BY ADDITION THERETO OF A NEW SECTION TO BE KNOWN AS SECTION 2.1

The City Council of the Town of San Anselmo does ordain as follows:

Section 1: A new Section to be known as 2.1 is hereby added to Ordinance No. 207 of the Town of San Anselmo as hereinabove entitled, which said new section shall read as follows:

Section 2.1: Wherever traffic is controlled at intersections by official traffic control signals, as described in Section 476 of the Vehicle Code of the State of California, and when a sign is erected at such intersection prohibiting any right turn against a "red" or "stop" signal, it shall be unlawful for any person operating a vehicle and facing a "red" or "stop" signal, to proceed through or against said "red" or "stop" signal to make a right turn or otherwise. All vehicular traffic facing a "red" or "stop" signal, where a sign has been erected at such intersection prohibiting any right turn against a "red" or "stop" signal, shall stop before entering the nearest crosswalk at any such intersection, and shall remain standing until "green" or "go" is shown alone by such official traffic control signal. The City Council may from time to time, by resolution, direct the Chief of Police to erect and maintain signs at intersections prohibiting right turns against "red" or "stop" lights, where it appears necessary.

Section 2: The foregoing ordinance, shall within fifteen (15) days after its final passage and adoption, be posted in three public places in the Town of San Anselmo, to-wit:

- (a) Bulletin Board at San Anselmo Post office,
- (b) Bulletin Board at San Anselmo Public Library,
- (c) Bulletin Board at San Anselmo City Hall,

which said places are hereby designated for the purpose of posting, and said ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days from and after its final passage and adoption.

The foregoing Ordinance was duly and regularly introduced at an adjourned, regular meeting of the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo held in said Town on the 19th day of ~~October~~ 1948, and was thereafter at a regular meeting of said City Council held in said Town on the 14 day of DECEMBER 1948, duly passed and adopted by the following vote:
