ORDINANCE NO. 348

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 155 ENTITLED
"AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ASSESSMENT, LEVY
AND COLLECTION OF TAXES", APPROVED NOVEMBER 4,
1918, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 14 and 17
OF SAID ORDINANCE.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1, Section 14 of Ordinance No. 155 of the Town of San Anselmo, entitled, "An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment, Levy and Collection of Taxes" approved November 4, 1918, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 14. On or before the first Monday of October of each year, the Assessment Roll shall be delivered to the Tax Collector of the Town, who shall within ten days after such delivery forthwith publish in a newspaper published and circulated in said Town, a notice specifying:

That the taxes on all personal property secured by real property and one-half of the taxes on all real property will be due and payable on the 1st day of November of each year, and will be delinquent on the 10th day of December next thereafter, at five o'clock P.M. and that unless paid prior thereto, eight per cent (8%) will be added to the amount thereof, and that if said one-half be not paid before the ^{10th} 20th day of April next thereafter, before five o'clock P.M. of said day, an additional three per cent (3%) will be added thereto; that the remaining one-half of the taxes on all real property will be payable on and after the 20th day of January next after said November above mentioned, and will be delinquent on the ^{10th} 20th day of April next thereafter, at five o'clock P.M., and that unless paid prior thereto, three per cent (3%) will be added to the amount thereof; provided, however, that whenever either December 10th or April ^{10th} 20th, shall fall on Saturday taxes shall become delinquent at

twelve o'clock noon on said date; provided further, that whenever either December 10th, or April 20th shall fall on Sunday or any other legal holiday, taxes shall become delinquent at five o'clock P.M. on the next succeeding business day.

That all taxes may be paid at the time the first installment, as herein provided, is due and payable.

The times and places at which payment of taxes may be made. The Tax Collector may fix a date in advance of the due date when payments may be made.

Section 2. Section 17 of Ordinance No. 155 of the Town of San Anselmo, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Assessment, Levy and Collection of Taxes", approved November 4, 1918, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 17. On the 10th day of December of each year, at five o'clock P.M., all taxes then unpaid, except the last installment of real property taxes, are delinquent, and thereafter the Tax Collector must collect, for the use of the Town, an additional eight per cent (8%) thereon; provided, that if said taxes be not paid before the 20th day of April next succeeding, at five o'clock P.M., he shall collect an additional three per cent (3%) thereon. On the 20th day of April of each year, at five o'clock P.M. all the unpaid portion of the remaining one-half of the taxes on all real property is delinquent, and thereafter the Tax Collector must collect, for the use of the Town, an additional three per cent (3%) thereon; provided, that the entire tax on any real property may be paid at the time the first installment, as above provided, is due and payable; and provided further, that the taxes on all personal property, unsecured by real property shall be due and payable immediately after the assessment of said personal property is made, provided, however,

that when the 10th day of December or the ¹⁰20th day of April, shall fall on Saturday, all taxes then unpaid shall become delinquent at twelve o'clock noon, on said date; provided further that whenever either the 10th day of December or the ¹⁰20th day of April shall fall on Sunday or any other legal holiday, all taxes then unpaid shall become delinquent at five o'clock P.M. on the next succeeding business day.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause this Ordinance to be published once in the San Anselmo Times, a weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in said Town of San Anselmo, and hereby designated for that purpose, and said Ordinance shall be in force and effect thirty (30) days after its final passage.

The foregoing Ordinance, duly and regularly introduced at a regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of San Anselmo, held in said Town the 10 day of February, 1953, and was thereafter at a regular meeting of said Town Council held in said Town of San Anselmo on the 10 day of March, 1953, duly passed and adopted by the following vote:
