ORDINANCE NO. ~~318~~ ⁴¹²

An ordinance of the City of San Anselmo amending Ordinance No. 318 entitled,

"AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO ESTABLISHING A PUBLIC POUND, CREATING OFFICE OF POUNDMASTER AND PRESCRIBING HIS POWERS AND DUTIES, PROHIBITING CERTAIN ANIMALS TO RUN AT LARGE, PROVIDING FOR LICENSING, IMPOUNDING AND DISPOSAL OF CERTAIN ANIMALS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF PROVISIONS THEREOF."

by amending sub-section 1(b); 1(c); 1(f); 2(a); 2(c):

The City Council of the City of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1, SUB-SECTION 1(b) of Ordinance #318 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Stray Animals--Dogs to be Leashed. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, having an interest in, harboring or having charge, care, control, custody or possession of any animal to cause, permit, or allow such animal to stray or run at large or be in or upon any public highway, street, alley or court, or any other public place or any unenclosed or unfenced lot or premises within the City of San Anselmo; provided, however, that all horses, mules and asses, harnessed or saddled, and in the actual custody or control of some person or persons, all dogs under restraint by leash or chain or 'at heel' beside a competent person and obedient to that person's command or confined within an automobile, and all dogs being exercised or trained in the field and under the control at all times of a competent person, are exempted from the operation of this section.

SECTION 2. SUB-SECTION 1(c) of Ordinance #318 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Duty of Poundkeeper to Seize and Impound Stray Animals.

It shall be the duty of the Poundkeeper to seize and impound all animals found upon any public highway, street, alley or court, or any other public place or any unenclosed or unfenced lot or premises within the City of San Anselmo, in violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. SUB-SECTION 1(f) of Ordinance #318 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Trespassing Animals.

Any animal found trespassing on any private premises in the City of San Anselmo in violation of the terms of this ordinance may be taken up by any person at interest and delivered to the Poundkeeper.

SECTION 4. SUB-SECTION 2(a) of Ordinance #318 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Seizure of Stray Dogs. The Poundkeeper shall seize and impound every dog found running at large or in or upon any public highway, street, alley or court, or any other public place or any unenclosed or unfenced lot or premises within the City of San Anselmo in violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. THE LAST SENTENCE OF SUB-SECTION 2(c) of Ordinance #318 is hereby amended as follows:

"The owner of any dog at the time it is so impounded may, at any time within thirty (30) days after such sale redeem the same from such purchaser by paying to him the amount of the purchase price paid by him to the Poundkeeper, and in addition thereto, a sum of equal to fifty (50¢) cents per day for the number of days from the date of sale to and including the

date of such redemption."

SECTION 6.


This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage shall be published in the Ross Valley Times, a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Anselmo, County of Marin, State of California.

The foregoing ordinance was regularly introduced at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of San Anselmo held in said City on the 11th day of December, 1956, and was thereafter at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of San Anselmo held in said City on the 8th day of January, 1957, duly passed and adopted by the following vote:
