ORDINANCE NO. 593 (Not Codified)

AN ORDINANCE (PURSUANT TO TITLE 7, CHAPTER 8 OF THE SAN ANSELMO MUNICIPAL CODE) REQUIRING THE UNDERGROUND INSTALLATION OF ELECTRIC AND COMMUNICATION UTILITY SERVICE WITHIN THE AREA OF GREENFIELD AVENUE BETWEEN LINCOLN AVENUE AND SIR FRANCIS DRAKE BOULEVARD AND ON RED HILL AVENUE BETWEEN THE PROJECTION OF THE CENTER LINE OF LINCOLN AVENUE AND SPAULDING STREET (WEST).

The City Council of the City of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1. (a) By Resolution No. 1272, a public hearing was called for October 14, 1969, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chambers in the City Hall, San Anselmo, California, to ascertain whether the public necessity, health, safety, or welfare requires the removal of poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures, and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, or similar or associated service, within that certain area of the City described as follows: Greenfield Avenue between Lincoln Avenue and Sir Francis Drake Blvd., and on Red Hill Avenue, Miracle Mile, between the projection of the centerline of Lincoln Avenue and Spaulding Street (West); and

(b) Notice of such hearing has been given to all affected property owners as shown on the last equalized assessment roll and utilities concerned in the manner and for the time required by law; and;

(c) Such hearing has been duly and regularly held, and all persons interested have been given an opportunity to be heard.

Section 2. Pursuant to Title 7, Chapter 8 of the Municipal Code of the City of San Anselmo, the above-described area is hereby declared an Underground Utility District, and is designated as Underground Utility District No. 2 of the City of San Anselmo. Attached hereto,

marked "Exhibit A", and hereby incorporated as a part of this ordinance, is a map delineating the boundaries of said District;

Section 3. The Council does hereby fix September 1, 1970, as the date on which affected property owners must be ready to receive underground service, and does hereby order the removal of all poles, overhead wires and associated overhead structures and the underground installation of wires and facilities for supplying electric, communication, or similar or associated service within Underground Utility District No. 2 on or before December 1, 1970;

Section 4. The City Clerk is hereby instructed to notify all affected utilities and all persons owning real property within Underground Utility District No. 2 of the adoption of this ordinance within ten (10) days after the date of such adoption. Said City Clerk shall further notify said property owners of the necessity that, if they or any person occupying such property desire to continue to receive electric, communication or other similar or associated service, they or such occupant shall, by the date fixed in this ordinance, provide all necessary facility changes on their premises so as to receive such service from the lines of the supplying utility or utilities at a new location, subject to applicable rules, regulations and tariffs of the respective utility or utilities on file with the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California. Such notification shall be made by mailing a copy of this ordinance together with a copy of said Municipal Code Title 7, Chapter 8, to affected property owners as such are shown on the last equalized assessment roll and to the affected utilities;

Section 5. The Underground Utility District herein created is in the general public interest for the following reasons:

- (1) The undergrounding to be accomplished will avoid or eliminate an unusually heavy concentration of overhead distribution facilities;

(2) The streets, roads or rights of way in the District are extensively used by the general public and carry a heavy volume of vehicular traffic.

Section 6. This ordinance shall be published once in full, within fifteen (15) days of its final passage and adoption in the Reporter, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the City of San Anselmo.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its adoption.

The foregoing ordinance was introduced at a regular meeting of the San Anselmo City Council held on November 18, 1969, and was thereafter at a regular meeting of the City Council held on December 16, 1969, duly passed and adopted by the following vote:
