ORDINANCE NO. 670

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANSELMO AMENDING TITLE 5, CHAPTER 3 OF THE SAN ANSELMO MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO GARBAGE AND INTRODUCING A RECYCLING PROGRAM

The City Council of the City of San Anselmo does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5-3.01, Subsections (a) and (b) are hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) "Wet garbage" shall mean all hygienic and food waste, and other waste generated from the preparation and/or consumption of food and/or beverages or which garbage is physically wet.

(b) "Dry waste" shall mean all waste other than wet garbage as defined in subsection (a) of this section.

(c) "Recyclable waste" shall mean all dry waste which is salvageable or can be salvaged when properly segregated.

SECTION 2. Section 5-3.02 is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, deposit, bury, or dispose of any garbage, refuse, rubbish and other waste, except as provided in this chapter, in or upon any private property, public street, alley, sidewalk, gutter, park, or other public place whatsoever or to throw the same in the bed or upon the banks of any stream or creek in the City or in or upon any of the waters thereof. Every person in the City having the obligation to dispose of garbage, refuse, rubbish and other waste shall dispose of the same only in the manner provided in this chapter through the Official Garbage Collector of

the City; provided, however, that any person himself may dispose of accumulations of dry waste by his personally hauling same to legal disposal facilities. Every tenant, lessee, or occupant of any private dwelling house or premises or furnished flat or apartment house, and the keeper or manager of every hotel, restaurant, eating house, boardinghouse, or other place where meals are furnished, and the owner or proprietor of every business or store shall have garbage collection service by the Official Garbage Collector at least once each week, or oftener if ordered by the Health Officer, and shall pay the Official Garbage Collector the monthly rates provided for in this chapter.

(b) For the purposes of this chapter, any dwelling unit in which there are cooking facilities, and which is occupied more than four (4) days in any one month, shall be considered to produce garbage and require garbage collection.

(c) The City of San Anselmo may require the Official Garbage Collector of the City to operate and maintain a recycling and reclamation program for any and all refuse collected within the City.

SECTION 3. Section 5-3.05 is hereby amended to read as follows:

The rates for the collection of garbage and dry waste for the period April 1, 1974, to December 31, 1974, shall be in accordance with a schedule set forth in this section which is adopted for a nine (9) month period. However, at any time after April 1, 1974, the garbage

collection rate shall be as the Council shall refix or redetermine notwithstanding that such rates may be greater or less than those for the period between April 1, 1974, and December 31, 1974. If the Council does not alter the rates for the time during or after the period ending December 31, 1974, the rates shall remain the same as they were fixed below.

(b) Commercial Rates (Subject to negotiations, but in no event, in excess of the following schedule:

\$2.50 per cubic yard, plus \$7.00 for debris box rental (2 cubic yard box).

50 cents per 32-gallon can (carried not more than 15 feet).

60 cents per 32-gallon can (carried not more than 15 feet, and up to and including 65 feet).

75 cents per 32-gallon can (carried beyond 65 feet).

(c) Debris Box Service on Occasional Basis. Eight and 50/100ths (\$8.50) Dollars for each debris box (2-yard capacity) to be picked up within twenty-four (24) hours after delivery of the box to the user's property if so requested, otherwise, to be picked up no later than seven (7) days from the date of delivery of the box. This charge includes box rental, delivery, pick-up and disposal. One Dollar (\$1.00) additional charge per day if box is required in excess of the seven (7) days from the date of delivery, and requestor has requested same.

(d) Selection of Service by User

(1) New residential users shall be informed of the types of service available and shall make their choice of service at the time of service. If no choice is made, the Official Garbage Collector shall provide and bill for single can non-recyclable service.

(2) Each year the Official Garbage Collector shall, during the month of November, send each residential user a form approved by the Chief Administrative Officer explaining the types of service available and notifying the user that if he wishes to change the type of service he shall advise the Official Garbage Collector prior to December 31 of that year. If no such request


is received by the Official Garbage Collector, he shall continue to provide the user with the same service he has most recently been receiving and bill the user at the rate effective for the ensuing calendar year. Any such changes shall be effective for the entire ensuing calendar year.
